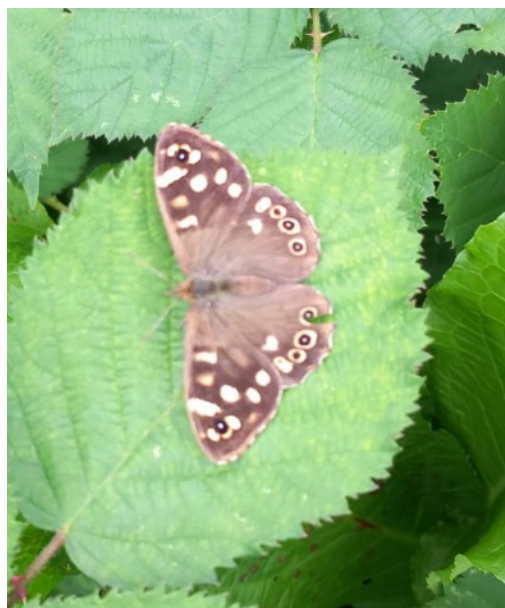

- E) Richness of habitats

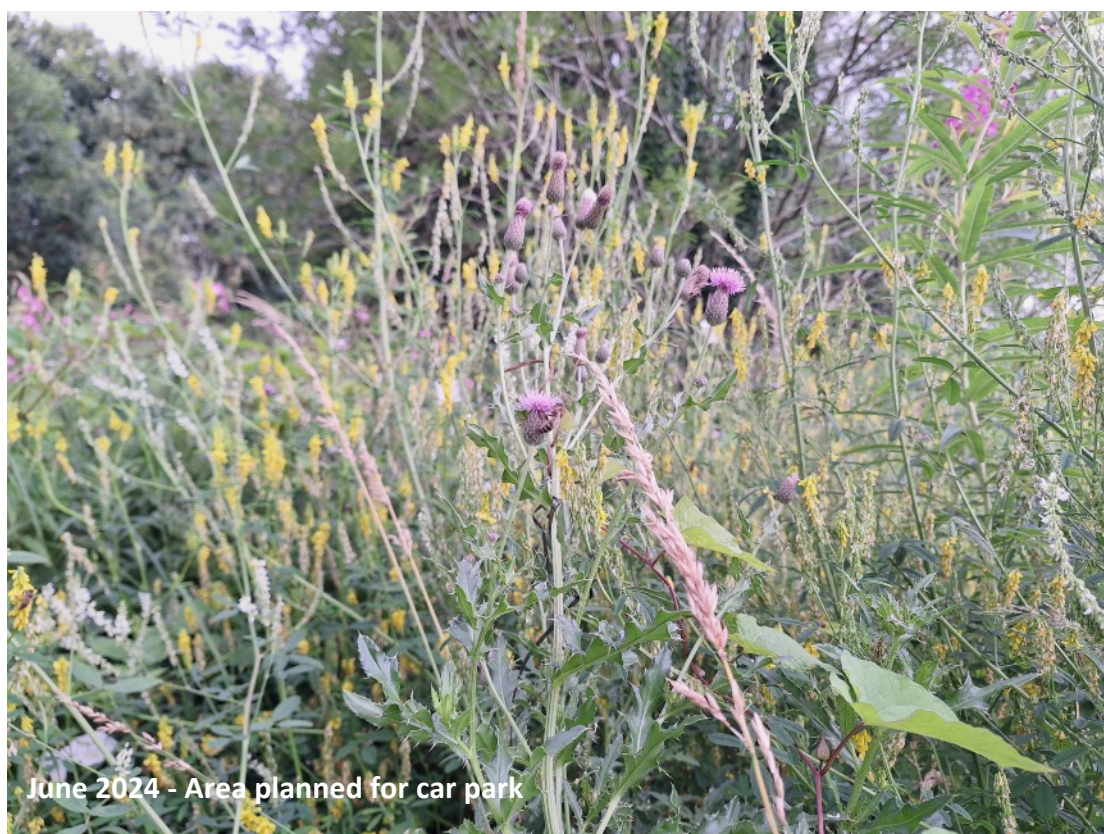
EWRG may also presenting video and audio evidence to further the representation

In order to establish a true reflection of the habitat quality of EWR visits and surveys must be conducted in spring and summer.



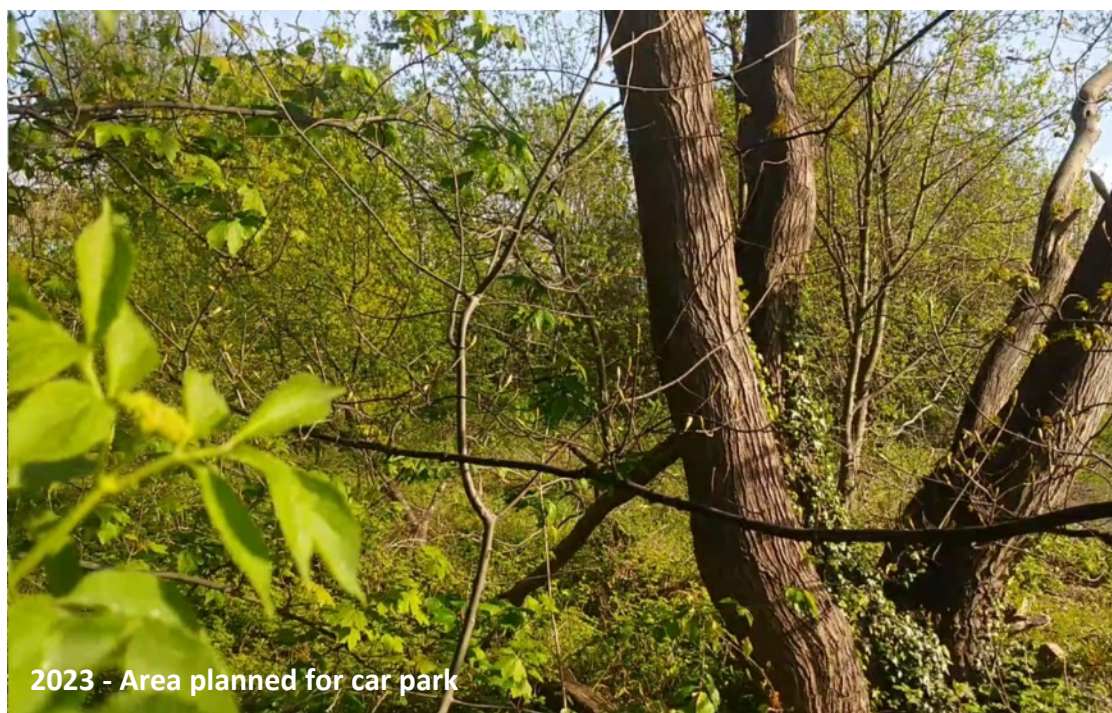


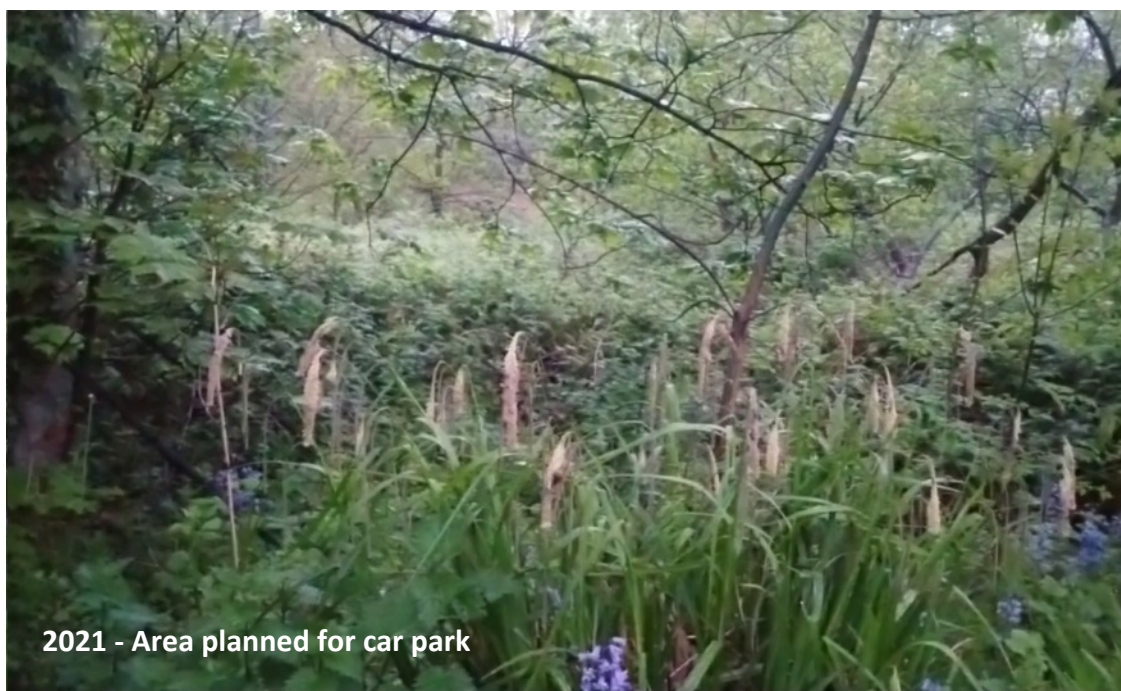
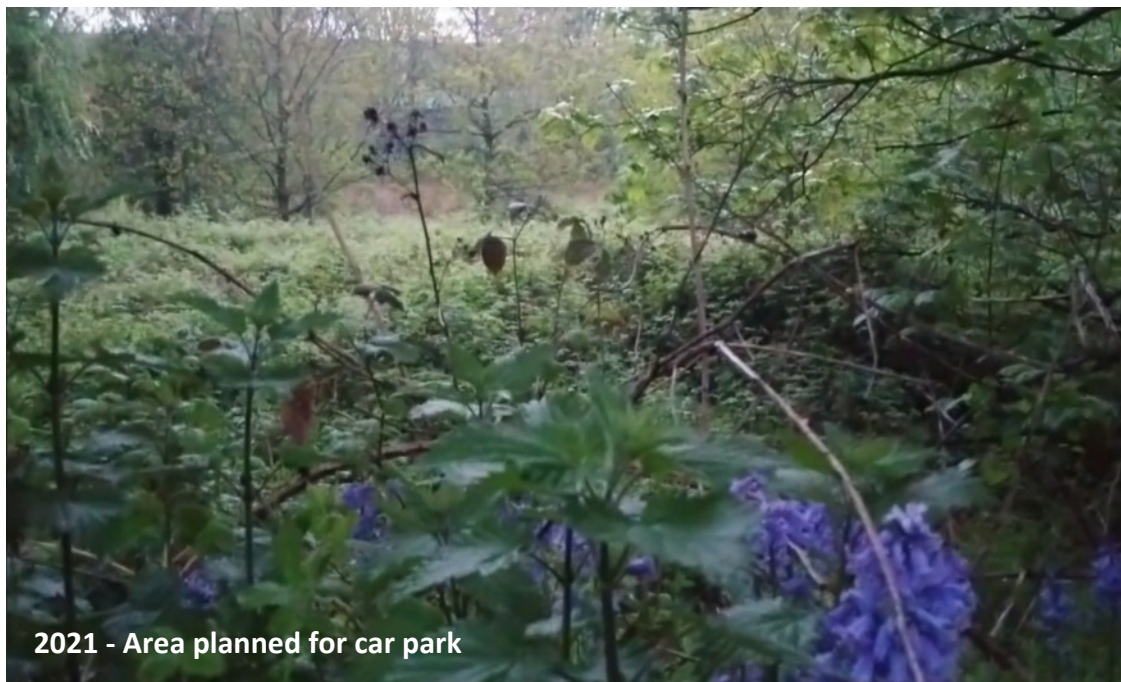

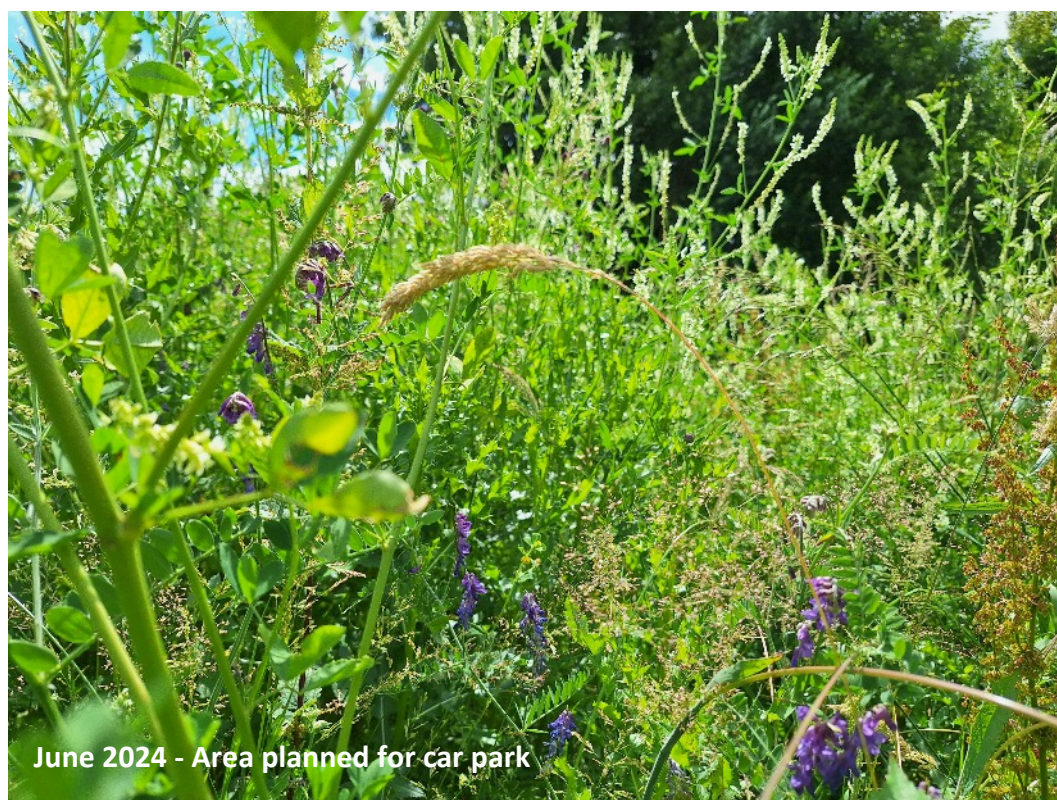

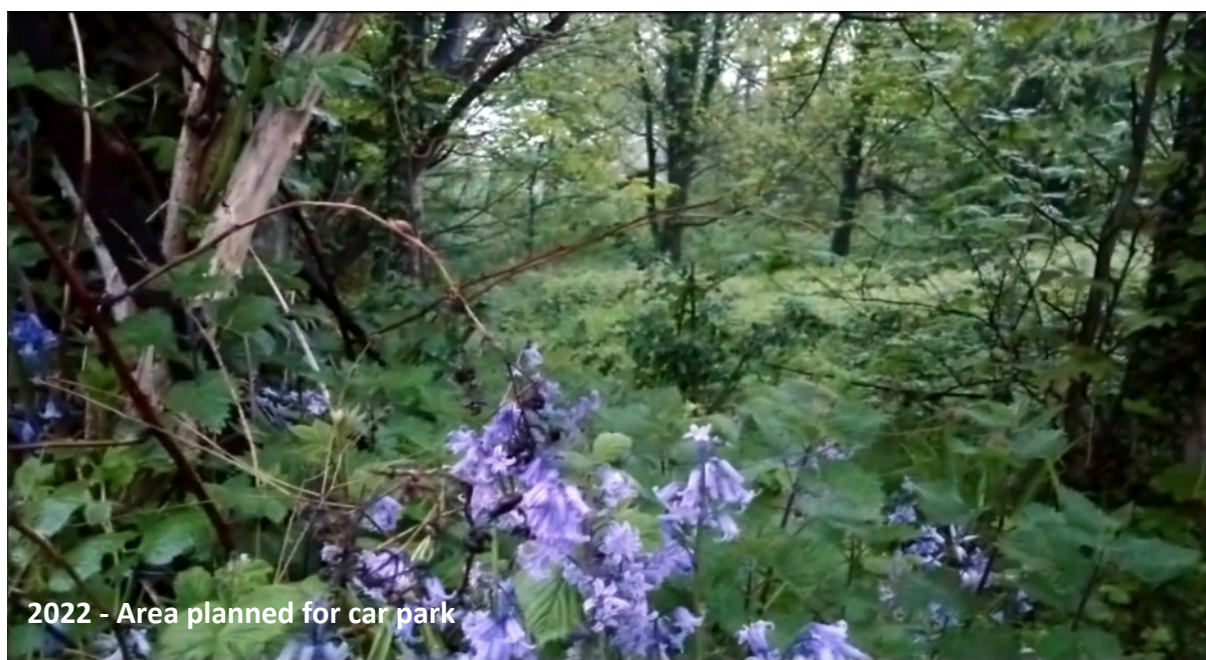
Sweet White Clover - Bees

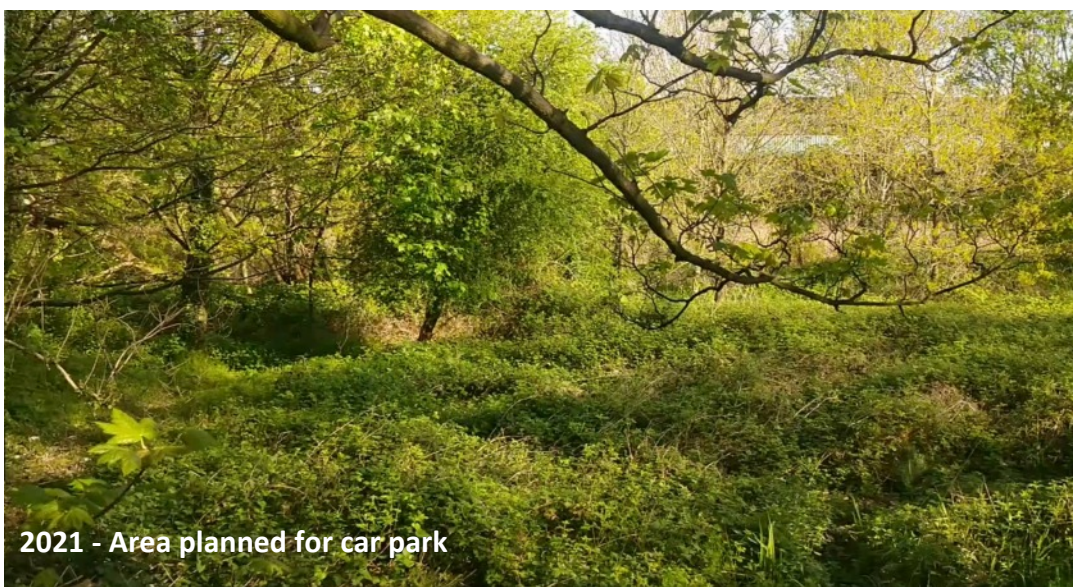


Sweet Yellow Clover - Bees



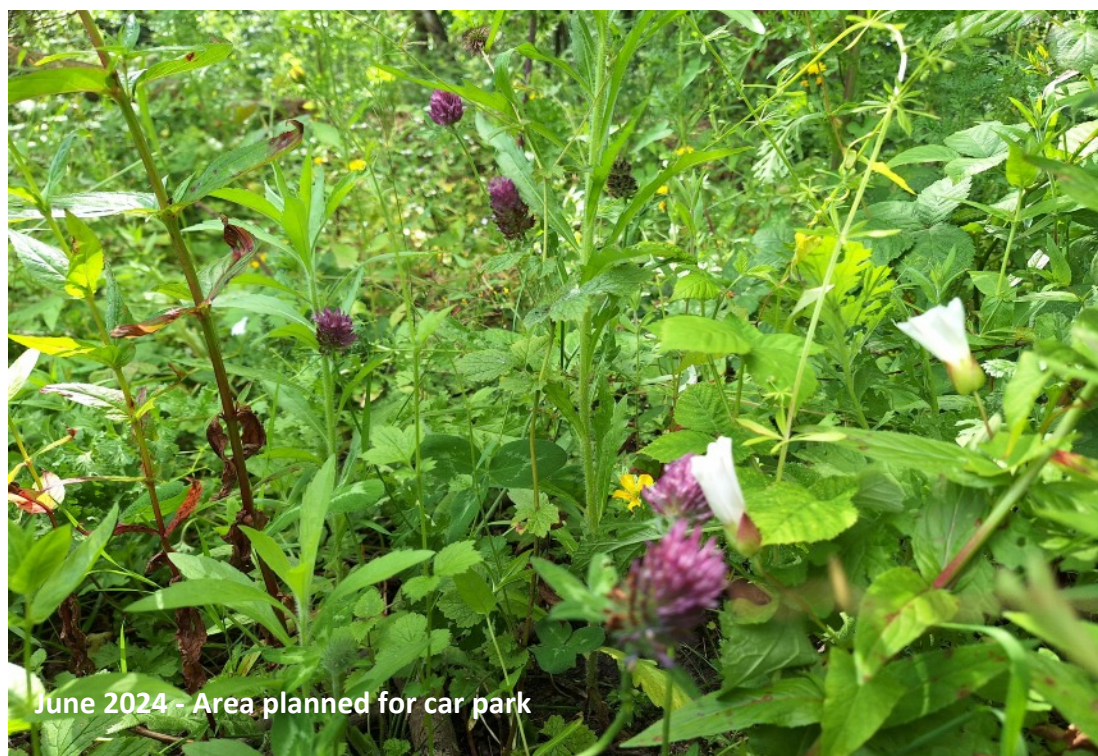
